## Behavior

- As a school, we are working to design a behavior plan that aligns with our leadership model. We believe that all behavior is communication as we seek to understand every child's individual needs.
- Teachers will continue to communicate with you on a regular basis regarding your child's behavior. In classrooms, you will not see discipline charts (i.e. stop lights, clip charts, Class, Dojo) but you will see positive reinforcements of expected behaviors and consequences for individual students.
